Victim's Justice Center Services

The goal of the Victim's Justice Center is to provide victims with information and assistance regarding their rights, their safety, and the resources available to help them cope with the emotional, physical and financial impact of the crime.

The Staff of the VJC:

- Provides victims with information about the case and the court process
- Accompanies victims and their families to court proceedings
- Provides advocacy and referrals to other agencies and services
- Assists with victim impact statements at sentencing

The VJC provides counseling, therapy, crisis intervention, and on-site referrals to support groups for families of homicide victims, elder abuse, domestic violence and sexual assault, child abuse and other crimes.

The VJC assists with crime victims compensation claims. You may qualify for medical or funeral expenses and/or loss of income.
